NARFE Chapter 1192 May 1, 2013 Chapter Meeting Minutes

CALL TO ORDER President Don Binder called the Chapter's monthly meeting to order at noon, Red Lion Hotel, Kennewick, Wash. He welcomed 17 members/1 guest, called for a moment of silence and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Secretary/Sunshine/Newsletter/PR Mary Binder.

- For "sunshine," Mary reminded members to let her know about members/families who may need a card get well, sympathy, congratulations, etc.
- The May/June chapter newsletter has been distributed; all members indicated they'd received a copy either mailed or electronic. Mary said that Nancy scrubbed the mailing list and eliminated 60 names, resulting in a savings of more than \$40. The ongoing effort to e-mail vs. mail the newsletter is helping save money as it costs about a dollar to print and mail copies. Treasurer's Report Nancy Crosby.

- Balance on hand as of March 31, \$4,262.21. April receipts were \$702.10 and disbursements, \$645.30, leaving a balance of \$4,319.01. Projected obligations are \$1,520.70, leaving an unobligated balance of \$2,798.31.
- <u>Monies collected at the May meeting/since the previous meeting</u> Luncheon, \$268, including 3 boxed lunches/\$10 each; Alzheimer's Research Fund, \$30; NARFE-PAC, \$4; Newsletter, \$65; 50/50 Raffle, \$24 collected/\$12 awarded (donated to Alzheimer's Research).

District V (Tri-Cities, Walla Walla, Yakima) Vice President Nancy Crosby. Nancy provided a "double, double reminder" to all about the WSFC-hosted Region IX Leadership Training workshop scheduled for noon Friday, May 31, to noon Saturday, June 1, in Ellensburg.
